Basin Management

The continued drought means that groundwater production is increased to meet the needs of consumers. San Antonio Water Company has water rights in three different basins. They are Cucamonga Basin, Six Basins, and Chino Basin. The water company shares these basins with other water agencies that have the rights for production. Continued production by water entities out of the basin could cause undesirable results such as overdraft and land subsidence.

These basins are adjudicated groundwater basins which mean an action was filed with the court to determine water rights and judgment based on negotiated water rights stipulated by the parties. Subsequent to that decision, the court appoints a Watermaster to implement the court judgment and proposed physical solution to mitigate undesirable results and provides a means of replenishment water and fees for those parties that overproduce.

Reduction of the amount of water that San Antonio Water Company produces out of these basins is in direct proportion of the water each shareholder is entitled. The record drought and lack of water recharge, presents the Watermaster the need to reduce the amount of water each party produces. You can help by conserving our precious water resource.

MANAGER'S MESSAGE

NEW RATES EFFECTIVE 9/1/14

The last of our Board approved scheduled rate increases went into effect September 1, 2014. This increase will begin with the Sept/October usage, which will be billed in November. The rate of increase is listed below:

Entitlement rate of .48 cents per hundred cubic feet (hcf = 748 gallons) will increase to \$.51 cents per hcf.

The Supplemental rate was increased in March 2014, due to the Drought Emergency Ordinance, from \$1.13 per hcf to \$1.33 per hcf (18% increase). The increase will remain as long as the Drought Emergency Ordinance is in affect. If the Emergency Ordinance is lifted, the new supplemental rate will be \$1.16 per hcf.

Water Efficiency Corner

Notification and Fines

On March 1, 2014, San Antonio Water Company implemented the Moderate Shortage conservation stage with associated water use restrictions as follows:

- No outdoor watering between the hours of 10am and 6pm
- No washing cars between Noon and Sundown
- No washing off driveways or sidewalks
- No pools filled between 10am and 6pm
- Excessive run off is prohibited
- All leaks to be fixed within 72 hours of discovery
- Use of pond, ornamental fountain or other structure making similar use of water is prohibited

If any of these violations are observed, the company will send a “customer notification” informing the customer of the issue. If the behavior continues, a fine will be instituted as per the Company’s Water Shortage Contingency Plan with the first offense being \$50 up to \$500. Please help conserve water by observing the above rules for water use. Any non-efficient use of water may be reported on our website www.sawaterco.com.

Leak Detection Program

We have an agreement with Mitchell’s Plumbing to perform Leak Detection for customers that may have a leak on their property and that have meet specific criteria outlined in the program as follows:

1. Must have an increase of 30% or more of water usage.
2. Determined by the water company that there’s a possible leak.
3. Water running continuously for at least one 24 hour period through the meter determined by interval data device on the meter.

SAWCo has agreed to pay for the Leak Detection Test performed up to 1/2 hour. Any additional time will be paid by the customer. Once leak is located, an estimate of the repairs will be provided and SAWCo will pay 1/2 the cost of the repairs, up to \$500, and until the funds have been depleted for the program.

The water company will contact those customers directly that meet the requirements listed above.
